

Dr. Phaedra Corso is the UGA Foundation Professor of Human Health and Director of the Economic Evaluation Research Group in the College of Public Health at the University of Georgia (UGA). She also serves as the Associate Director for the Owens Institute for Behavioral Research. Dr. Corso is known for her research in economic evaluation and economic impact assessment, primarily in the areas of child maltreatment and substance use prevention. From 1991-2006, she conducted health economics research for public health interventions at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. In 2006, Dr. Corso joined the faculty at UGA as the first founding Head of the Department of Health Policy and Management. She holds a master's degree in public administration from UGA (1991) and a doctoral degree in health policy from Harvard University (2000).
