

Dr. Chris Krebs is a Chief Scientist in RTI's Center for Justice, Safety, and Resilience. He has extensive experience planning and conducting studies that involve cross-sectional and longitudinal research designs; survey development and testing; experimentation; survey data collection with different and mixed modes (e.g., web-based, in-person, telephone, and mail); data analysis; and dissemination. Dr. Krebs has extensive experience studying victimization, including intimate partner violence, stalking, sexual harassment, sexual coercion, and sexual violence, as well as risk and protective factors for, and the consequences of, these experiences. He has conducted research with adolescents and young adults, and he worked on the design, testing, and implementation phases of the CDC-funded National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey (NISVS). He led the NIJ-funded Campus Sexual Assault (CSA) and the Historically Black College and University Campus Sexual Assault (HBCU-CSA) Studies, as well as the recently released Campus Climate Survey Validation Study (CCSVS) that was funded by the Bureau of Justice Statistics and the Office of Violence Against Women.
