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


Take Home Points

- The <u>onset or etiology of substance use is complex</u> and requires a complex preventive approach
- Like other health issues, there is a <u>natural history of substance use</u>
- Through our understanding of the natural history of substance use highlights points for <u>successful intervention and support</u>
- Taking an <u>epidemiologic approach to defining service need</u> in any community suggests:
 - the need for a comprehensive system of services to address the prevention of substance use and of the effects of substance use on individuals, families, and communities, and,
 - such a system of services not only saves lives and enhances productivity within communities but ultimately is cost effective




The Etiology Model, Vulnerability and Risk and Protection






Natural History of Substance Use

A Population-Based Approach to Service Needs Assessment

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- Do not use substances and are not 'vulnerable'
- Do not use substances AND ARE Vulnerable such as children of substance users, those stressed because of poverty or abuse, etc.
- Initiated use and may or may not experience consequences
- Meet a DSM diagnosis for substance use and need treatment BUT do not utilize treatment




A Population-Based Approach to Service Needs Assessment


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
Comprehensive Service Delivery System (Harm Reduction in Purple)
