

Robert Schwartz co-founded Juvenile Law Center in 1975 and has been its executive director since 1982. From 1996-2006, Schwartz was a member of the MacArthur Foundation Research Network on Adolescent Development and Juvenile Justice. He co-edited *Youth on Trial: A Developmental Perspective on Juvenile Justice* (University of Chicago Press: 2000). From 1991 to 2012, he was a gubernatorial appointee to Pennsylvania's State Advisory Group that distributes federal funds in Pennsylvania and advises the governor regarding juvenile justice policy. He is immediate past chair of the American Bar Association's Commission on Youth at Risk. Juvenile Law Center helped uncover the scandal depicted in this year's feature documentary, "Kids for Cash."
